India's Dairy Industry Sector is set to grow at a double digits over the medium term. With economy growth, there is immense potential of the sector –moving from basic milk to value added products.

Being the largest producer in the world with negligible exports- the sector is ripe for uncovering value.

Considering this global majors like Lactalis, Cargil, and other strategic investors are picking up stakes in Indian dairy sector.

In this scenario, we bring this Dairy Directory 2026, which is an attempt to report on the dairy companies with producers profile, current capacity, and expansion plans etc., along with details of address, tel, fax, email and details of key personnel.

Overview

India is the leader in milk production. It is *numero uno*. It has around 300 million cows and buffaloes deployed with production capacity of dairy products rated around 239 million tpa. However, production per cow/buffalo is the lowest among the world, as India do not adopt modern practices for various reasons.

The strength of Indian dairy is in the resourcefulness of unorganized segment. For many rural household, cattle is a supplementary income not an intensive business venture. It does not get specialized food nor there is any attempt to improve yield. Usually cattle grazes around freely, without major expenses towards cattle feed. This is also one of the strength of Indian dairy, as compared to developed countries, in times of downward in economy, investors usually find themselves in dire straits. Here dairy industry support itself. However, this scenarios is slowing changing, as rural famers begin to look at dairy as a separate economic unit and factory farms are coming on stage.


The Efficiency Shift (2025–2030)

The next five years will focus on closing the "yield gap." Several factors are driving this transformation:

Organized Processing: Only about 40% of milk is currently handled by the organized sector (cooperatives and private players). By 2027, this is expected to rise to 55%, which will improve hygiene standards and reduce waste.

Feed and Nutrition: One of the primary reasons for low productivity is poor nutrition. Forecasts suggest a surge in the Total Mixed Ration (TMR) market, where balanced nutrition is provided to cattle, potentially increasing individual animal yields by 15-20%.

Technological Integration: The adoption of IoT-enabled "Smart Farms" is rising. Tools for heat detection, health monitoring, and automated milking are moving from large corporate farms to smaller cooperatives.



Indian Dairy Sector

Value-Added Products (VADP): The market for cheese, paneer, and probiotic drinks is growing at 15-18% annually, significantly faster than liquid milk (5%). This shift is attracting massive private equity investment into the dairy supply chain.

The sector is expected to grow at double digits at medium term. With economy growth, an increase in per capita consumption of milk, with improving affordability, shift towards premium milk and an increase in consumption of value-added products. Among the states Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Gujarat are key producers.

However, Dairy exports from India are negligible, given that the country produces largely buffalo milk and that indigenous value-added products are considerably different from those in developed countries who have different taste of paneer, yoghurt etc.,. Hence, the milk produced in India will be largely consumed in the domestic market

The rise and potential of Indian dairy has attracted global investors in recent years. KKR India, local arm of the New York-based buyout entity, Lactalis, Danone of France, Cargil Ventures have started investing in Indian dairy companies, picking up strategic stakes.

About the Company

A.R Dairy Food Pvt Ltd is primarily engaged in the manufacturing and marketing of milk. The company also sells other products like milk powder, butter, curd, butter milk, flavoured milk and packaged drinking water. The company was initially promoted by Mr. R. Rajasekaran, in the name of Sarayu Cryogenics Pvt Ltd during 1995. Sarayu was engaged in the manufacturing of liquid oxygen. During 1998, the name was changed to A.R Dairy Food Pvt Ltd and the entity commenced business of procuring & selling milk and milk products. The company’s milk processing unit is located in Dindigul, Tamil Nadu and has an installed capacity of ~ 2.0 lakh liter per day (LLPD)

About 80-85% of milk is directly procured from farmers. If the locality is having a potential of providing 300 litres per day they will have a small collection centre with an investment of 1.5 lacs. Till date they have 350+ collection centre across Tamilnadu. And 125 new collection centre opened between Jan 17 – May 17. Whereas, remaining 15-20% is procured from 5 outsourced chilling centres located in Gopal Patti, Perambalur, Trichy, Thorainagar and Karur. They are also manufacturing SMP from own milk and marketed in the brand name of RAAJ.


